Definition of Terms:

* **Embedded:** Any applicable courses from the curriculum can be applied to satisfy this competency. No additional credits are generated for embedded requirements. The credits are counted only in the category the course fulfills.

** **Overlap:** A single course that satisfies both *Domains of Knowledge* requirement **and** a Major requirement. Departments can require a maximum of three overlaps in a Major. The overlap courses must be counted as General Education credits.

*** **Double-dipped:** A single course that satisfies a maximum of **two** General Education categories. The double-dipped course will be noted as fulfilling the requirements of both categories, but credits will be counted only once toward the General Education 40-credit minimum.

Application of Credits to the 40-credit minimum:

Embedded credits are not counted toward the General Education 40-credit minimum.

Overlap credits are counted only as General Education credits -- not as credits in the Major.

Double-dipped credits are counted only one time toward the General Education 40-credit minimum.
