## Head Coach Keith Bugbee

**Keith Bugbee** enters his 26th season as head men's lacrosse coach and assistant professor of physical education at Springfield College in 2009. Under his direction, the Pride is one of the top programs in the nation. Bugbee's coaching record stands at an impressive 267-126 (.679 winning percentage). In 2003, he became one of only four active coaches in Division III with over 200 victories.

Bugbee was named the USILA Division II Coach of the Year in 1994 and 1995. He coached the North team in the annual North-South All-Star Game in 1995 and was the coach for the West squad in the annual New England All-Star Game in 1986. Bugbee served as president of the New England Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association and was

inducted into the New England Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 2002.

Bugbee's teams have competed in 21 post-season tournaments, including eleven NCAA Tournaments, and won a national championship. Thirty-eight of his players have received All-America recognition, most recently with Tyler Montgomery earning honorable mention accolades in 2008.

In 2001, Bugbee led the Pride to a school-record 16-2 mark and a No. 5 final national ranking. Springfield led the nation in scoring and scoring margin.

Bugbee was named the Pilgrim League Coach of the Year in 2003 after leading the Pride to an 11-5 record and the NCAA tournament.

## Facilities

The men's lacrosse team plays at Stagg Field, newly renovated in the summer of 2007. The new FieldTurf® field, the 2000th installation of FieldTurf world-wide, replaces the former AstroTurf surface. The stadium, with a seating capacity of 3,867, is lighted according to NCAA standards for night games and has a heated and air conditioned press box. Stagg Field has played host to numerous NCAA football, field hockey, and men's and women's lacrosse championships.

## 2009 Season Preview

Led by a solid corps of returners, including 10 seniors, the 2009 men's lacrosse team looks to build on its trip to the second round of the NCAA Tournament last season.

Heading up the Pride's offense, which returns 78% of its output last season, will be senior Pilgrim League First Team selection, **Jake Beebe**. Beebe powered the Pride attack last season as he tallied 65 points off 35 assists and 30 goals. In his sophomore campaign, **Kyle Gable** erupted for 26 goals and 13 assists to finish with 39 points, second only to Beebe. **Joe Heney**, who notched 20 points in '08, will also give Springfield options on the offensive side of the ball.

Running the midfield in 2009 will once again be **Chris Jez**, who had a standout year at the face-off "X", winning 57% of his draws and scooping up a team-best 82 groundballs. **Jake Jones** and **Joe Macchi** look to create offense out of the midfield as the duo combined for 38 points, including 29 goals last season. **Kyle Louer**, who tallied 18 points on attack last season as a freshman looks to also make an impact in the midfield.

Defensively the Pride looks to be very solid with the return of three senior all-league selections in first-teamer **Sam Burrell**, and second-team selections, **Mike Smith** and **Tony Albano** in the cage. Albano came into his own in the starting role in 2008, owning a 7.71 GAA average and making 184 saves.

Bugbee hopes that his large and talented recruiting class will be paying dividends come NCAA Tournament time in 2009.
